Description

Moths are some of the most beautiful (and weird!) looking animals in Sussex but we rarely see them. This course allows you to come face to face with these amazing insects and learn all about them.



What we'll do

The evening starts with a presentation on the moths of Sussex before we open the previous night's moth trap to study what we have captured. After the moths are released we will set up a moth trap elsewhere on the reserve and watch as the moths arrive at the light. No previous knowledge required.



The tutor

Michael Blencowe works for the Sussex Wildlife Trust as their Community Wildlife Officer. He's based in Lewes and runs a packed programme of events all across Sussex celebrating the rich diversity of wildlife found in our county. Through these walks, talks and training courses he inspires people to become more involved with studying, recording and conserving the fantastic species and habitats we have here in Sussex.

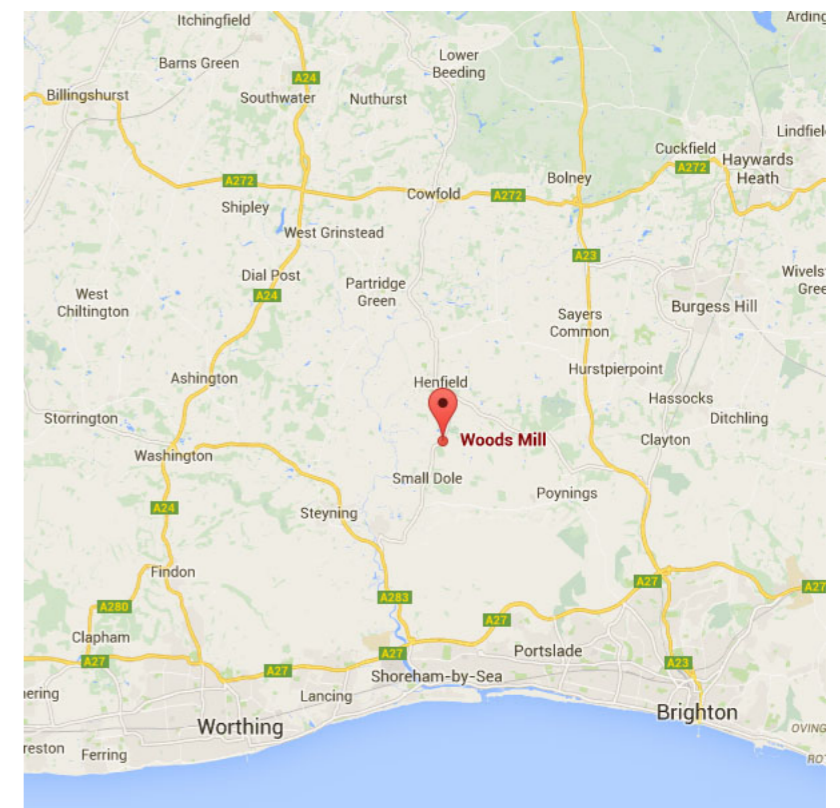
